3. PROGRAM INNOVATIONS

New guidelines for the Highest Awards (Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards)

The two-year transition period from the "old" award guidelines to the "new" (Journey) guidelines ended on Sept. 30, 2011. As of Oct. 1, all girls pursuing the Bronze, Silver or Gold Award **must be** using the new guidelines.

Gold Award

As a courtesy to the seniors in high school who have been working on their Gold Award under the old guidelines we will allow those girls to finish their Gold Award using the "old" prerequisites, but maintaining the current Gold Award standards and processes. This means we require the girls to do the proposal and final interviews, and we will hold them to the current Gold standards: individual project, 80 *suggested* project hours, and sustainable actions. The deadline for all girls who would like to be honored at the June 2, 2012, ceremony is March 15, 2012. We must have their final paperwork and interview completed by this date.
