The sports locale or hint is mentioned below; it is your job to figure out how to get from one place to the next place. You can walk; drive; use the “L” trains, Metra trains, CTA buses, or free trolleys – whatever works best for your group. Two hints: 1.) you may want to plan your trip BEFORE you get downtown; 2.) if you’re planning to use public transportation, you may want to buy a 1-day Ventra card at the first el stop you get to so you can use it all day.

Read through the clues below to decide where to go (hint: go in order of the clues to make your life easier!). At each stop, take a photo – you should be in the photo, too! P.S. wouldn't it be great if you were in your Girl Scout gear?! You can use a map app on your phone to help you find your way, and parents have the super secret answer key ☺

You can go any day or time you want! Remember to dress for the weather and to wear comfy shoes. Note: you don't have to stop at every single location on the list if you're pressed for time.

1. Whether you call it Comiskey Park, The Cell, U.S. Cellular Field, or its current name, the Chicago White Sox play at this southside field.

3. Chicago's professional women's basketball team, the Chicago Sky, plays at the newest stadium in the bunch. This arena was built in 2017 and also houses DePaul University's basketball games.
4. One of Chicago's roller derby teams, the Windy City Rollers, plays here. University of Illinois Chicago sports' teams play here, too!
5. This ice arena is the practice home for the Chicago Blackhawks and a space for the community to go ice skating! It features 2 NHL-sized ice rinks and was opened in 2017.
6. Home to both the Chicago Bulls & the Chicago Blackhawks, this arena hosts over 200 events a year! Can you find Michael Jordan?
7. Depending on the time of year you do this scavenger hunt, there's a big ice skating rink right by a GIANT bean 😊 Even if it's not winter, you can still visit the nearby park for some great photo opportunities.

4. *UIC Pavilion, 525 S. Racine* One of Chicago's roller derby teams, the Windy City Rollers, plays here. University of Illinois Chicago sports' teams play here, too!
