

Lenona Lodge (Dream Catcher & Merrybrook)

**Brownie Corral Shelter** - An outdoor shelter great for use as a gathering place for up to 80 people. Available mid-April thru late-October.

## Lodging:

**Bonnie Brae** – Open loft lodge with dining/kitchen on first floor, sleeping 24 on bunk beds available mid-April thru mid-October. Amenities include kitchen with range, refrigerator, fireplace; portable toilet and showers nearby.

**Cloverleaf Tents –** Eight screened platform tents that sleep four each on cots. Amenities include campfire cooking, refrigeration and latrine toilets.

**Idle a while** – Open room lodge with one semi-private room sleeps 36 people year round on bunk beds. Amenities include kitchen with range, refrigerator, indoor bathroom, fireplace and showers nearby.

**Lenona Lodge** – This air conditioned year round lodge has two sides, **Dreamcatcher** sleeps 20 and **Merrybrook** sleeps 22, both on floor mattresses. Dreamcatcher has a commercial kitchen; Merrybrook has a galley kitchen and fireplace. Attached restrooms and showers and screened dining area are shared by both sides. Each side has a leader room.

**Prairie Cabins** – Seven unfinished cabins sleep four people each on cots and are available mid-April thru mid-October. Amenities include electricity, refrigerator in main cabin, campfire cooking, portable toilets and showers nearby.

**Trailblazer Tents –** Six screened platform tents that sleep four people each on cots. Amenities include campfire cooking, refrigeration and latrine toilets.

**Brownie Corral** – Open area that sleeps 20 in your own tents. Amenities include shelter, water spigot and fire scar. Flush toilets and showers are available at the Shower House. Available mid-April thru late-October.
