## Requirements for Brownie and Junior Girl Scouts

Complete at least two of the following requirements:

- Complete the word search in the packet provided by the Museum.
- Take a picture of the activity you like the most and (either you or a parent) post on social media and tag Illinois Holocaust Museum @ihmec and Girl Scout GCNWI @girlscoutsgcnwi and use #takeastand.
- Girl Scouts, though young, can be great helpers. Pick one person you see today and, in your notebook, write down how that person was a great helper.
- Create a record of your visit by preparing a booklet/poster. This can include photos, drawings, brochures, or highlights of your visit. Share these with your friends and family or on social media; please tag Illinois Holocaust Museum @ihmec and Girl Scouts GCNWI @girlscoutsgcnwi and use #takeastand.

## Complete the Museum Scavenger Hunt

The Scavenger Hunt should be completed in the “Make a Difference! The Harvey L. Miller Family Youth Exhibition” located on the second floor of the Museum. Use your notebook to write down your answers to the questions below.

### *In Our Voices*

- Watch the introduction video.
- What are two lessons we can learn from history in these videos?



### *Choices*

- What person inspires you the most and why? Explain why you picked this person.
- Draw a picture of this person being an Upstander.

### *Who are You on the Inside?*

- Find three or four words that describe you the best and make a rubbing of those words. Share with your group why you chose those words. How many words can you find that are also in the Girl Scout Law?

### *What Would You Do?*

- Complete the three different scenarios offered. Draw a picture of yourself in one of the scenarios.

### *Upstander Oath*

- Make a pledge to be an Upstander using the computers in the exhibit. Do you see any similarities to the Girl Scout Law?

### *Tell Your Story*

- What was the problem in your community that you documented?

- Visit the Take a Stand Center (located on the ground level of the Museum). Using the computers, take the quiz to learn how you can become an Upstander.
- Select one of the activity options provided on the quiz and complete it within the next week.
